Open Discussion

HYPOTRICHOSIS

Questions were asked as to what the Associations around the world were doing to manage Hypotrichosis. Different Associations are looking at this and reacting in different ways. Several members gave their view or their association's view on how to address this situation. Dr Eggleston, USA had been involved with the USA Belted Galloway Society's approach to managing Hypotrichosis and suggested that testing be recommended and then allow breeders to make their own decision on whether they would use the bloodlines of carriers. This method would see the numbers be reduced. It was also recommended that when semen or embryos are collected, that the donors be tested. Those attending would go back to their associations to outline the general opinion on how to manage this condition.

Any other discussion

With Foot & Mouth still affecting some areas of the world, it was recommended to safeguard as much genetics as possible. A Worldwide register of Genetics may be beneficial.
